### Scotchtown

Only original standing home of Patrick Henry that is open to the public. Henry lived here from 1771 to 1778 when he was a leading figure in revolutionary Virginia and elected first governor of the new Commonwealth. House constructed ca. 1719 for Charles Chiswell of Williamsburg. Eight rooms and central passage on one floor with clipped-gable roof. Reproduction outbuildings.



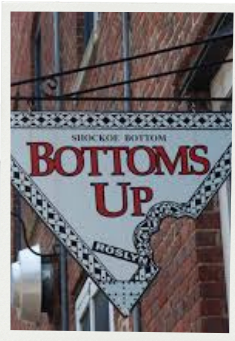
### St John's Church

Completed in 1741. Enlarged beginning in 1773. Present transept is original part of 1741 church. One of just a handful of frame churches to survive from colonial Virginia. Original pulpit with inlaid sun on underside of type like Christ Church. Historic graveyard includes burial site of George Wythe.



### Give Me Liberty or Give me Death

From March 20 to March 27, 1775, St. John's hosted the Second Virginia Convention. Here on March 23rd, Patrick Henry delivered his "Give me liberty or give me death" speech. Our group will be treated to a private reenactment of this speech. Joining Henry will be founding fathers Thomas Nelson, George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Peyton Randolph, Richard Henry Lee, & others.
