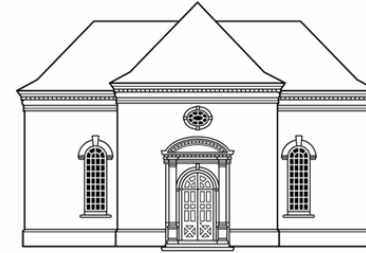
## ABOUT THE PRESENTERS

**Jerrilyn Eby** and **Rick MacGregor** are Stafford County historians who have researched that area for more than four decades. Jerrilyn grew up at Aquia Church and worked for 31 years as a middle school librarian while conducting research into county deeds, wills, tax records and newspapers with a focus on land tracts, mills, and industries. Rick is a generational resident of the Aquia Creek area, having grown up on the creek within sight of some of the freestone quarries. He retired from VDOT after 35 years. In 2021, Jerrilyn and Rick published *The Great Rock of Aquia: The Freestone Industry of Stafford County, Virginia and Beyond*.

**Lois Crane Williams** is a local author and historian. Her most recent book is *Two Centuries of Slavery in Lancaster County, Virginia*, published by the Lancaster Virginia Historical Society, where Mrs. Williams serves on the Board of Directors. In 2016, Mrs. Williams sponsored a historic highway marker near the Norris bridge entitled “69 Slaves Escape to Freedom” about members of Corotoman’s enslaved community who escaped to the British during the War of 1812.

**Garland Wood** recently retired after 40 years as a master carpenter at the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation. He began his career at CWF in a summer position, attracted he said to the idea of wearing “funny clothes.” Using traditional tools and methods, Mr. Wood and his team reconstructed almost 50 buildings in Colonial Williamsburg, including the James Anderson Blacksmith Shop, the Peyton Randolph House, and R. Charlton’s Coffehouse.
